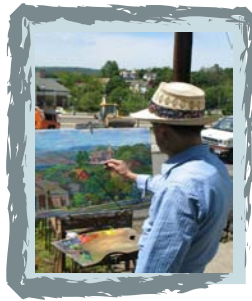

Though her mother moved to the Midwest when she was a child Virginia has always considered the mountains to be home. In the fall of 2002 she returned and now lives with her husband, John, on Cherry Mountain near Hayesville, North Carolina. Virginia studied art at the Kansas City Art Institute and Wichita State University. She was an artist for Hallmark Cards before joining IBM where she worked for 20 years. She continued to study and develop her art with numerous artists during the her years in the corporate world. She taught watercolor to people with Alzheimer's disease as part of the nationally recognized Memories in the Making program.

Virginia teaches watercolor at the John C. Campbell Folk School where she is also the Assistant Resident Artist. Her work can be seen at the linen shop, All Tucked In, located on the Square in Hayesville.

Virginia works in several media including oil, pen and ink, pencil and watercolor. She loves the beauty of the mountains especially the wildflowers.
